



FrancoFilm Festival 2022 at Cinema Akil celebrates “Belonging” in its 12th edition

Dubai, United Arab Emirates | March 25, 2021 - [Cinema Akil](#), Dubai's only independent cinema, and in collaboration with the Embassies of France, Switzerland, Belgium and Canada in the United Arab Emirates, announces the launch of the 12th edition of the **FrancoFilm Festival**, which will run from March 25-31, 2022, with a special screening at Manarat Al Saadiyat, Abu Dhabi on March 27.

The co-production-focused festival features ten regional premieres across genres, including critically acclaimed drama, documentary, and animated feature films.

FrancoFilm is an annual festival aimed at celebrating the French language through cinema. This year's film lineup focuses on the theme of “Belonging” in recognition of immigrant and host societies.

The FrancoFilm Festival lineup will present co-productions from nine countries opening with a screening of the award-winning Ukrainian-French-Swiss co-production ***Olga by Elie Grappe*** winner of the SACD Award at the Critic's Week at the Cannes Film Festival 2021. The program includes Tunisian-French co-production; ***A Tale of Love and Desire***, Leila Bouzid's latest feature and the closing film of the Critic's Week at the Cannes Film Festival and Canadian-Vietnamese drama ***14 Days, 12 Nights*** by Jean-Philippe Duval. FrancoFilm's 12th edition will also include a special screening of environmental documentary ***Bigger Than Us*** directed by Flore Vasseur produced by Academy Award Winner Marion Cotillard which had a Special Screening at the Cannes Film Festival 2021 a film that follows seven young climate activists from Malawi, Indonesia, Lebanon, Uganda, Brazil, Greece and USA fighting for their world against the perils of climate change.

In February 1939, Spanish republicans were fleeing Franco's dictatorship to France. The French government built concentration camps, confining the refugees, where they barely have access to hygiene, water and food. In one of these camps, separated by barbed wire, two men will become friends. One is a guard and the other is Josep Bartoli (Barcelona 1910 – NYC 1995), an illustrator who fights against Franco's regime.

Embassy of Canada

Embassy of Switzerland

More than 200 Swiss companies have chosen the country as a hub for their Middle East and Asia business activities, and a diaspora of 3,000 Swiss nationals lives here. Today, this relationship has diversified to include education, research, innovation, financial affairs, energy cooperation, sustainable development and cultural diplomacy as well.
